

Fedliving residences admissions and allocation criteria

Within Fedliving residential communities we offer a range of academic, social and development opportunities to provide our residents with a supportive, positive, balanced and memorable university experience.

The following selection criteria are applied when allocating places to new and returning applicants seeking to live at Federation University residential accommodation during the period of their academic studies.

To be eligible to apply for Federation University residential accommodation the applicant, must be enrolled (or intend to enrol) as either a

1. Federation University student
2. Monash University student studying at the Gippsland or Berwick Campuses
3. Other University students enrolled full-time studying at a higher education institution within 25kms of Fedliving residences

The following selection and allocation guidelines are considered when reviewing and prioritising eligible applicants:

- secondary school leavers (within the preceding 5 years)
- geographic origin with priority given to applicants relocating >100kms from campus
 - including domestic and international applications
- students applying for Federation University residences for the first time
- year of study/faculty/program
- current enrolment status and study load
- record of previous academic achievement
- suitability for residential living including
 - impacts or potential impacts on the residential community
 - risks to themselves and/or others
 - ability to contribute and/or commitment to the residential community.
 - returning residents: previous positive commitment to residential life or community (eg volunteering)
- gender balance of the residential community
- Camp Street and Victoria Street Residences: allocation preference is given to students studying at the Camp Street or SMB Campuses.

Final offer and allocations decisions are at the discretion of Manager, Commercial Services, and Senior Manager, Student Wellbeing, taking into the account the above allocation criteria in addition to the Fedliving licence agreement.
