



Other Achievements



Liam Frost-Camilleri attended the National Association of Enabling Educators of Australia (NAEEA) 7th International Conference on Enabling Education, titled: *Shaping the Future of our Discipline*, hosted by Charles Darwin University in Darwin on December 2nd to 3rd. This conference highlights the intersections of First Nations perspectives, digital innovation, and student well-being within enabling education, as well as navigating the themes of Al disruption, digital learning practices, self-efficacy, and the ongoing development of government policies affecting the enabling sector. Enabling education is an important avenue for Australians to access higher education, especially those coming from non-traditional

backgrounds. It is an extensive and expanding part of Higher Education in Australia.

Liam won NAEEA's inaugural Teaching Excellence Award for outstanding teaching in the Federation University FAST enabling program, that has been sustained and evidenced through exceptional teaching satisfaction scores and qualitative comments from students.

In December, **Anthony Pearce** successfully completed his PhD confirmation at Deakin University. His research examines how teachers and students adapt to changes in applied learning provisions in Victoria, under the supervision of Ass. Prof. Trace Ollis and Dr Kellie Tobin. The confirmation panel included Andrew Skourdoumbis (Chair, Deakin University), Marg Malloch (Victoria University), Gary Argent (Deakin University), Cheryl Ryan (Deakin University), and Helene Rooks from the Victorian Applied Learning Association (VALA).

Anthony's study looks at how teaching and learning influence and shape applied learning pedagogy, in the context of the Victorian Certificate of Education Vocational Major (VCE VM) and the Victorian Pathways certificate (VPC). Using the theory of practice architectures, it examines what teachers and students say, do, and how they interact in the realisation of applied learning. The research employs a theory-practice nexus, combining practice architectures and action research to involve teachers and students in a reflective practice cycle. It uses focus groups and observations to explore what enables and constrains practices in both secondary and nonsecondary schools. The goal is to understand how applied learning is enacted in education and identify what conditions support or limit it, with an emphasis on students as active participants in shaping these practices. The findings aim to improve applied learning pedagogy and provide insights for policy and practice in secondary and vocational education environments.

New member

Introducing our newest member to the RAVE research group. **Sharon McDonough**



Sharon is an Associate Professor in Teacher Education in the Institute of Education, Arts and Community at Federation University Australia. She has advanced disciplinary and research knowledge of sociocultural theories of emotion, resilience, and wellbeing. She draws on this knowledge to explore professional development for educators, initial teacher education, how to develop resilient and mindful educational communities, and how to support and advance a focus on wellbeing and learning across the lifespan in the community more broadly.

Sharon's research expertise lies in qualitative approaches, including creative research methods, and she has published widely in international journals. Sharon is recognised nationally and

internationally for her research and teaching and was awarded the Australian Teacher Education Association (ATEA) 2022 Research Recognition Award (co-awarded to McDonough & Selkrig). She is the co-author of Building and Sustaining a teaching Career: Strategies for Professional Experience, Wellbeing and Mindful Practice (Lemon & McDonough, 2020, Cambridge University Press), and co-editor of: Exploring Time as a Resource for Wellness in Higher Education: Identity, Self-care and Wellbeing at Work (Routledge, 2024); Ethics, self-study research methodology and teacher education (Brandenburg & McDonough, 2019, Springer);

Mindfulness in the Academy: Practices and Perspectives from Scholars (Lemon & McDonough, 2018, Springer); and Teacher Education: Innovation, intervention, and impact (Brandenburg, McDonough, Burke & White, 2016). Sharon currently co-facilitates the Mid-Career Education Research Network across Australia, with the network running under the auspices of cADRE.

Sharon is currently researching the kinds of everyday learning that occur in community contexts and through leisure pursuits, particularly through engagement in craft and making. Her recent work in this area includes: "A gendered therapeutic learning landscape: Responding creatively to a pandemic" (Foley et al., 2022); "Ties that bind or exclude? Knitting and craft groups as contested spaces of inclusion and exclusion" (McDonough et al., 2022), and a forthcoming chapter "You can always learn something new": Women learning about skills, self, and community through craft' (McDonough & Foley) in the edited book *Adult Learning in Community & lifelong Contexts: Learning for study, work and life* (Foley & Ollis, in preparation).
