### Course Rules

In order to qualify for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, students must satisfactorily complete a total of 360 credit points.

Students must complete:

4 core courses (60 CP):

- FEAFN1101 Foundations of Knowledge; and
- BAXDC2004 Applied Ethics in Contemporary Societies.

1 Major of 120 CP from

- History
- Sociology
- Indigenous Studies
- Literature
- Media and Screen Studies
- Writing.

1 Minor of 60 CP or a second major of 120 CP from:

- History
- Sociology
- Indigenous Studies
- Literature
- Media and Screen Studies
- Writing
- Community Work
- Criminal Justice, Education
- Visual Arts
- Visual Culture\*
- Marketing
- Entrepreneurship
- Web Project Development
- Behavioural Studies.

\* Note: Visual Culture is only available as a 60 CP minor.

A discipline major consists of 120 credit points and is made up of:

- At least 15 CP at Introductory level
- At least 30 CP at Intermediate level
- At least 30 CP at Advanced level

- An additional 45 CP at Introductory, Intermediate or Advanced level
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A minor sequence consists of 60 credit points and is made up of:

- At least 15 CP at Introductory level
- An additional 45 CP at Introductory, Intermediate or Advanced level

Students may complete no more than 150 CP of their degree at Introductory level.

**Electives:** Students may choose [electives](#) for their remaining units. While most electives will be sourced from the Bachelor of Arts program, students will be given the option of choosing electives from any Federation University undergraduate program as per yearly offerings and contingent on the student meeting the course prerequisites.

### Glossary

<b>Co-requisite (CoR):</b>	A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit
<b>Pre-requisite (PR):</b>	A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit
<b>Exclusion(s) (EX):</b>	A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
<b>Introductory (Intro):</b>	Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
<b>Intermediate (Inter.):</b>	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
<b>Advanced (Adv.):</b>	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
<b>Major/Minor:</b>	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
<b>Semester:</b>	Designated teaching period
<b>CR:</b>	Credit Point value
