Course Rules

Students must complete all the core compulsory units within the course structure over 3 years (or part-time equivalent).

Each unit is usually worth 15 credit points.

A total of 360 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the course requirements of the Bachelor of Education Studies.

Students will complete a minimum of four Education units at an Advanced level, coded EDBED and numbered 3000+

Students may not do any courses starting with EEZED, except EEZED1711.

You will also be required to complete two major specialisations of six units each in two areas of study. This should include two units at the Advanced level, with numbers 3000+. Students may be able to change to a combination of a major of eight units and a minor of four units with permission, but this limits your options with future courses.

The Education department recommends students choose at least one of Mathematics, Science, Humanities or English. Students wishing to complete a Physical Education or Outdoor Education major, or minor should consider the SO5 Bachelor of Sport, Physical and Outdoor Education. Please contact the Program Coordinator.

Elective options change from time to time. Please check this each semester.

Please complete the Introductory units (numbers 1000-1999) first, then Intermediate units (numbers 2000-2999), then Advanced units (numbered 3000+).

At the beginning of the second year, you can apply to transfer to another undergraduate Education course at Federation University, where you can qualify as a teacher and gain registration with VIT. Please note that students must have successfully completed 8 units in the 1st year of the Bachelor of Education Studies and have a credit average to be eligible for transfer.

Course Requirements

Students will need to apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) card before commencing their course. A copy of the WWCC card must be supplied to the University prior to commencing professional experience placements. More information can be found at the WWCC website.

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Glossary

Co-requisite (CoR):	A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit
Pre-requisite (PR):	A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit
Exclusion(s)(EX):	A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
Introductory (Intro):	Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
Intermediate (Inter.):	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
Advanced (Adv.):	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
Major/Minor:	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
Semester:	Designated teaching period
CR:	Credit Point value
