## Glossary

- Co-requisite (CoR):** A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit
- Pre-requisite (PR):** A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit
- Exclusion(s)(EX):** A unit that is the equivalent to another unit & so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
- Introductory (Intro):** Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
- Intermediate (Inter.):** Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
- Advanced (Adv.):** Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
- Major/Minor:** The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
- Semester:** Designated teaching period
- CR:** Credit Point value
