WHAT IS PLAGIARISM?

Presenting another person's work (or that created by Artificial Intelligence) as your own.

Taking someone else's work or ideas, information or words, and claiming them as your own is plagiarism.

It can be accidental eg forgetting to cite your sources, or not paraphrasing correctly.

It can be intentional eg using material from an academic cheating service, text spinner apps, or using Artificial Intelligence without authorisation and acknowledgement.
