Course Rules

In order to qualify for the degree of Bachelor of Criminology and Criminal Justice, students must satisfactorily complete a total of 360 credit points. All students must complete one of the following two options as part of their course:

Option 1: A Major consisting of 6 units from one of the following study areas: Sociology, Community and Human Services, Behavioural Studies, or IT Security. At least 1 3rd level unit must be undertaken for satisfactory completion of the Major.

Option 2: A Minor consisting of 4 units from the following study areas: Indigenous Studies, Sociology, Writing, Community and Human Services, Behavioural Studies or IT Security. Students completing a Minor must complete 2 additional Elective units.

Option 3: Students transitioning from the Diploma of Criminology and Criminal Justice or Associate Degree of Criminology and Criminal Justice must choose a Major or Minor from the following options: Sociology, Community and Human Services, Behavioural Studies.

Additionally:

Students must successfully complete CRJUS 1285 and CRJUS 1287 prior to commencing a second- or third-year unit, except for CRJUS 2475, which is offered in first year second semester.

Students must complete a minimum of 60 points at intermediate level (second year) core CRJUS units before enrolling in advanced third year core CRJUS units.

Students must complete a minimum of 90 points at advanced (third year level).
