Word limits and formatting	Total word limit per application up to 5,950 words	Total word limit per application reduced to 1,000 (Level B); 1,900 (Level C); 2,150 (Levels D and E).
	Graphs, tables and images permitted in application forms	Tables, charts and other graphics are not to be included in the application form. They may however be referenced in the application and included in full in the supporting evidence document
Submission process	Application and supporting evidence submitted via OneDrive	Application and supporting evidence submitted as a single PDF document and emailed to <u>od@federation.edu.au</u>
Appeals and feedback	Intention to appeal followed by formal appeal to be submitted within 10 days	Simplified appeals process with a 10-day deadline to lodge an appeal
