### Course Requirements

Students in the Hybrid course must study on a full-time basis.

If you are planning to attend core subject classes face-to-face or virtually, then please enrol in the Mt Helen class. If you are planning to attend core subject classes online, then please enrol into the online class.

Students must complete all the core compulsory units within the course structure over 1.5 years (or part-time equivalent).

A total of 240 credit points is compulsory to satisfy the course requirements of Initial Teacher Education (ITE) courses, as well as a minimum of 80 days professional experience. You will also be required to successfully complete external Literacy and Numeracy tests prior to registration as a teacher.

Please note that International Students are not eligible to study this course online.

Students will need to apply for a Working with Children Check (WWCC) card before commencing their course. A copy of the WWCC card must be supplied to the University prior to commencing professional experience placements. More information can be found at the WWCC website.

## **Glossary**

<b>Advanced (Adv.):</b>	Units that are coded 3000 – 3999, advanced-level units
<b>APAC:</b>	Australian Psychology Accreditation Council
<b>Co-requisite (CoR):</b>	A unit or units that must be completed concurrently with the chosen unit
<b>CR:</b>	Credit Point value
<b>Exclusion (EX):</b>	A unit that is the equivalent to another unit and so excludes students from repeating an equivalent unit
<b>Introductory (Intro):</b>	Units that are coded 1000 – 1999, introductory-level units
<b>Intermediate (Inter.):</b>	Units that are coded 2000 – 2999, intermediate-level units
<b>Major/Minor:</b>	The main subject area of study completed as part of a degree
<b>Pre-Requisite(s) (PR):</b>	A unit or units that must be completed prior to undertaking another unit
<b>Semester:</b>	Designated teaching period
